

Mrs. Lucille Vogt Dies; Interment Ann Arbor, Mich.

Mrs. Lucille Benz Vogt, wife of William G. Vogt, Carrollton attorney and Assistant Attorney General, died Thursday evening, April 7 in Boyd Memorial hospital at the age of 47. She had been seriously ill since last summer when she was taken suddenly ill while on a trip to Florida with her family.

She was born Oct. 8, 1912 in Dexter, Mich., a daughter of Otto A. and Emma K. Zahn Benz. She was graduated from the University of Michigan, at Ann Arbor, and on August 24, 1946 was married to Mr. Vogt, the ceremony taking place in Ann Arbor.

Since her marriage she had been a resident of this city. She was a member of First Presbyterian Church; Chapter D.K. of P.E.O.; a charter member of the local chapter of the American Association of University Women; Temple Chapter, Order of Eastern Star; the West End Reading Circle and the L.M.I. club.

Besides her husband she is survived by three daughters Barbara Lucille, Kathryn Benz and Mary Susan, her mother, Mrs. Emma Benz of Ann Arbor, Mich.; and two brothers, Herbert O. Benz of Ann Arbor and Dr. Carl A. Benz of Adrian, Mich.

Funeral services were held Saturday afternoon at the Presbyterian church. The Rev. Percy Clark officiated and Mrs. Carroll Tapp was the organist.

Pallbearers were Thomas Hough, Philip A. Daum, James Nims, Joe Davidson, Jack Alfeld, Orville Lovekamp and Dr. Paul A. Dailey.

Following the service the body was taken to Ann Arbor, Mich., where services were held Monday afternoon at the Muegig Funeral Home. Interment was at Ann Arbor.
